# A Message from the Director



Change is inevitable, but the amount of change we've experienced as individuals and as a collective whole during the last 18 months has been unprecedented. Every phase of this pandemic has brought unparalleled challenges that have tested our resiliency time and again.

COVID-19 has had many far-reaching impacts from policies and procedures for the health and safety of all, ongoing changes to exhibition scheduling, and virtual/digital adaptations to museum resources. All of these changes have brought to light the advantage of an experienced museum team that is able to pivot, reinvent and make adaptations with creativity and flexibility while, at the same time, providing programmatic stability. Having suspended TAM's volunteer program in March of

2020 for the health and safety of our cherished weekly volunteers, preservation of TAM's team also became crucial in providing the manpower necessary to simply keep the museum doors open to the public.

I am fortunate enough to be able to work with dedicated, strong women who I am lucky enough to also consider dear friends. Juggling their regular museum responsibilities alongside the daunting challenges many parents of young children were confronted with during the pandemic, business manager, Jessica Hull Livesay and museum coordinator, Jesse Martin managed to keep TAM's facility sanitized and its doors open to the public. Their dependability during such turbulent times was instrumental in enabling me the ability to focus on addressing the significant and sudden drop in earned revenue critical for general operations. A big 'thanks' to TAM intern Maya Peters Greño who became a treasured member of our team and without whom we would not have been able to survive without our beloved volunteers.

In typical cowgirl spirit, TAM's education director, Alexa Stanger, along with TAM educator Diane Earnest, overcame insurmountable odds through persistent dedication in navigating daunting logistics with area public schools to provide virtual outreach classroom visits via Zoom to students throughout eastern Idaho, as well as other meaningful virtual art education experiences in the midst of a pandemic.

I could have never imagined fifteen years ago, when I began my association with TAM as a weekly volunteer, that I would find a place of belonging . . . a family at this little art museum along the banks of the Snake River. As I have mourned the loss of so many cherished members of our TAM family during the last 18 months, I have often reflected on the many remarkable individuals I have had the privilege of rubbing shoulders with because of my association with the art museum. I continue to be amazed and ever so grateful for the sincerity of your hearts and generosity with your time, resources and talents. A very special thanks to outgoing board president, Kerry Martin and TAM's "jack-of-all-trades," Joe Keller, who both epitomize extraordinary service to TAM and our community in their own distinct capacities.

However precarious the days and months ahead might be, I am more confident than ever before, that together we can make it through whatever challenges lie ahead!

## TAM Education Program

Despite the many challenges the pandemic presented to our education program, we were able to pivot and make virtual adaptations to many of our in-person learning opportunities.

## ARTworks

Since 2003, TAM has taken art processes into regional elementary school classrooms to strengthen students' understanding of and skills in the arts, brought students to TAM for guided exhibit tours with related art lessons, and provided visual arts educational opportunities for area educators.

TAM continued to serve as a vital visual arts resource for local schools, community organizations and families throughout the pandemic. Through TAM's education program, ARTworks, which implements the Idaho Humanities Performance Standards.

Museum-sanctioned art educators provided 80 virtual art lessons in third and fourth grade classrooms in Idaho Falls and 60 classrooms in 10 rural schools including Dubois, Arco and Firth, extending free hands-on art-making opportunities safely amidst the pandemic.

The ARTworks outreach program impacted over 4,800 students, teachers and family members during the 2020 – 2021 school year. TAM educators used Zoom to provide virtual lessons to students across the region. Free art supplies were boxed up and either picked up or delivered to each school prior to each lesson.

“Take & Make” Free Family Days provided exhibit-inspired art kits that families could pick up at the museum and complete at home, offering art-making opportunities to more than 1,200 community members. Each month, in collaboration with Newspapers in Education, TAM offered a full-page, full-color art lesson in the local newspaper, the *Post Register* (circulation 20,000).

In March, the annual *Young at Art* exhibit and the *Congressional Art Competition* featured the artwork of over 500 Idaho students, grades K – 12.

## Youth Classes

In 2020 – 2021, TAM offered weekly virtual afterschool art classes (September – May) to youth ages 6 – 13. Students explored core art principles, developed fine art techniques and engaged in a broad range of art-making processes from drawing to sculpture. Additionally, we were able to return to in-person clay classes for youth in August with very limited class sizes, physical distancing and masks required.



# In Loving Memory


