

# 2022-23 Exhibit-Based Art Lessons

During an ARTour, students are led on a structured tour of TAM's exhibit with an emphasis on key concepts from the featured art. After the tour, students assemble in TAM's classroom for a hands-on art lesson related to the tour discussion. The lesson further extends understanding of exhibited material. Lessons are aligned with grade-relevant art standards and corresponding standards in math, science, language arts or social studies.



### **Group Fees**

Guided tours for school groups are \$2 per student. Maximum group size is 50 students. \$30 minimum tour fee. Guided tours with lessons for school groups are \$3 per student. Maximum group size is 30 students. \$45 minimum tour fee.

## Chaperon Policy

We require one adult chaperon per 10 students. Admission is free for up to three chaperons. Additional adults accompanying the group are required to pay the \$4 admission fee. Adults accompanied by additional children cannot be considered chaperons and will be charged regular admission fees. Scholarships available.
