# ARTWORKS

**ARTworks lessons are available to kindergarten through fifth grade classrooms in School District 91 & 93 and school-wide visits in rural schools across the region.**

Lessons are led by a museum sanctioned artist instructor and are aligned with the Idaho and National Core Arts Standards.



Lessons are related to museum exhibits and provide hands-on exploration of 2- or 3-dimensional art processes, art history, art appreciation and technical instruction.

After the classroom lesson, classes are invited to visit the museum for a follow-up exhibit tour and related art lesson. Limited bussing scholarships are available.

Schoolwide classroom visits are also available at no cost to underserved elementary schools and rural schools in Eastern Idaho.

All visits must be scheduled a minimum of **two weeks in advance**.

## AFTER YOU SCHEDULE

### PRE-VISIT PRIMER

You will receive an email message confirming our visit. This email will include an image that will be highlighted in our lesson. Please take a few minutes to share this image with your students and have a short discussion prompted by the three Visual Thinking Strategies questions included in the message to build interest and curiosity about the upcoming lesson.

### ARTworks OUTREACH CLASSROOM VISIT

When we visit your classroom, a museum artist instructor will provide a lesson overview and student rubric that will be used throughout the lesson. Students will learn about an artist and art process, then engage in a compare-and-contrast discussion about the works. Students will apply ideas from the discussion in a hands-on art-making process. Problem solving and personal expression are encouraged!

After completing the lesson, the class will engage in a group critique of finished artwork. The instructor will revisit the rubric with the students to evaluate student learning.

You will receive a lesson evaluation form from the instructor at the time of the visit, inviting you to provide valuable feedback.

## GUIDED ARTours

During guided tours, students learn about the artwork in the current exhibit, how to look at art, and how to read exhibit labeling. Tours are focused on a theme that is well demonstrated in select pieces of art from the exhibit. We suggest 30 minutes for a guided tour. Guided tours are \$2 per student.

## ARTours WITH A LESSON

In addition to a guided tour of the exhibit, students can take part in a post-tour art lesson in the museum's classroom. The art lesson reinforces the theme explored in the tour and gives students a hands-on opportunity to use this theme in the creation of their own work. The guided tour with an art lesson is approximately 60 minutes and costs \$3 per student for school groups with a minimum price of \$45. All tours must be scheduled a minimum of **two weeks in advance**. Scholarships are available.



### GROUP FEES

*Guided tours for school groups are \$2 per student. Maximum group size is 50 students. \$20 minimum tour fee.*

*Guided tours with lessons for school groups are \$3 per student. Maximum group size is 50 students. \$45 minimum tour fee.*

### CHAPERONE POLICY

*We require one adult chaperone per 10 students. Admission is free for up to three chaperones. Additional adults accompanying the group are required to pay the \$4 admission fee. Adults accompanied by additional children cannot be considered chaperones and will be charged regular admission fees.*

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
